### **Comprehensive Safety Analysis 2010 (#09101)**

DOT's Comprehensive Safety Analysis 2010, which is scheduled for implementation this year, has been described by DOT as a "paradigm shift." It is designed to identify drivers and employers who pose safety risks based on their crash experience and violations of safety regulations. CSA 2010, which will replace the existing SafeStat system, is an attempt to further decrease the number of accidents, injuries, and fatalities involving commercial vehicles. Those accidents and fatalities have been decreasing for decades but appear to have reached a plateau, and the number of vehicle miles driven by commercial vehicles is increasing. CSA 2010 will place more responsibility and accountability on drivers and will allow DOT the opportunity to interact with far more driver employers.
